Since 1987, we have hosted a [summer teacher institute](#) for K-12 humanities educators to receive professional development training. Over the years, hundreds of teachers from every Idaho county have participated. This summer, 26 teachers and 10 scholars will convene at the Idaho State Museum in Boise for a week to prepare to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence.



Once again, the IHC will be able to bring the Smithsonian's [Museum on Main Street](#) program to rural communities around Idaho! *Voices and Votes*, an exhibit based on a major exhibition at the Smithsonian's National

Museum of American History, will visit Rupert, Moscow, Coeur d'Alene, and Priest River. Since 2020, over 17,000 Idahoans have seen a Smithsonian exhibit in Idaho because of this program.

The IHC values the important work of K-12 humanities educators across our state! We recognize their outstanding work with an annual award for three teachers. We are excited to announce this year's winners: **Angela DeLeon Guerrero** from Liberty Elementary School in Boise, **Tiffanie Bird** from Moscow Middle School, and **James Lauritsen** from Madison High School in Rexburg.

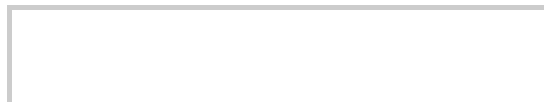
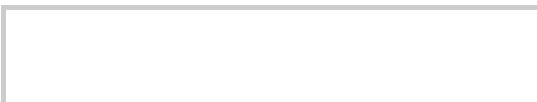


Take a Hike with the Humanities

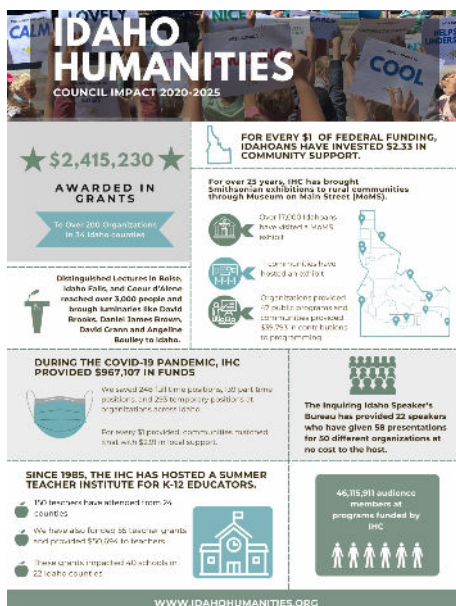
What's Happening?

On April 2, the Department of Governmental Efficiency (DOGE) canceled hundreds of National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH) grants nationwide—including those supporting the Idaho Humanities Council—putting critical cultural programs across our state at risk. These cuts are illegal. The money was appropriated by Congress, as it has been on a bipartisan basis for more than 60 years.

Since 1973, IHC has funded requests amounting to \$8,226,572 in grants and awards provided to Idaho organizations and educators. We have supported 587 organizations in every county and reached countless individuals. Since 2020, IHC has hosted a total of 745 live and virtual programs attended by 47,581,935 people and our grant recipients have conducted 2,617 programs.

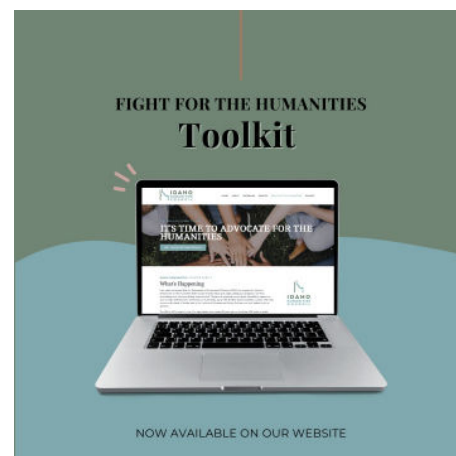
The NEH is IHC's largest funder. Our organization was created 53 years ago to distribute NEH funds to public humanities projects in communities all over Idaho. The loss of NEH funding has had a devastating impact on our ability to serve our communities. Without this funding, we will remain unable to provide grant support. As a result of this loss of funding, our grants program remains suspended until further notice and all but a few programs are on pause.

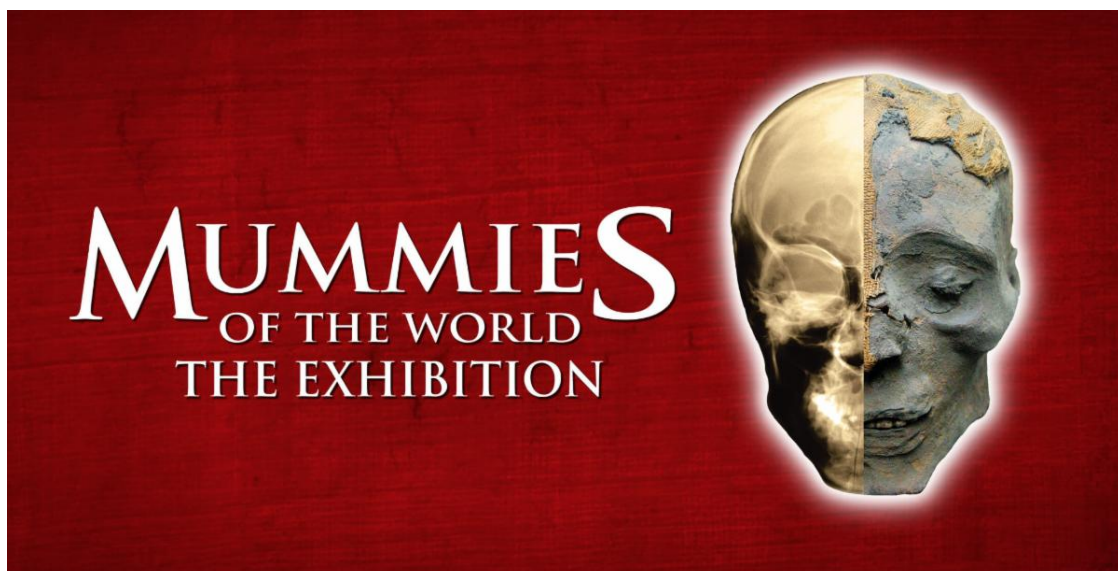

New Exhibit at the Museum of Idaho

Our grant program remains suspended at this time. The IHC is unfortunately no longer accepting applications for grants until further notice. In the meantime, we will continue to highlight programs previously funded by the IHC.

Last October, the IHC Board of Directors awarded the Museum of Idaho a grant to bring *Mummies of the World: The Exhibition* to Idaho Falls. Come face-to-face with one of the largest collections of real mummies and related artifacts ever assembled. The exhibit is a rare chance to experience and learn from real mummies from South America, Europe, and Ancient Egypt at the Gem State's largest humanities and science center.
