



IHC Provided \$45,190 to Cultural Organizations across Idaho

In 2025, 21 Idaho organizations in Idaho received \$45,190 in grant funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities through IHC's Grants programs. These funds were used for the organizations' public humanities programming including multiple lecture series, exhibits, and discussion programs.
